Size

6 months (1 year, 2 years)

Finished Measurements

Chest 20 (23, 24) inches
Hem to Shoulder length 10 ½ (12, 13 ½) inches
Sleeve Length 6 (7, 8) inches
Hat: 15 ½ (17 ½)

Materials

Brown Sheep Cotton Fleece (80% Cotton, 20% Wool [215 yards/skein])
2 skeins MC (Shown in CW120 Honey Butter)
1 skein CC1 (Shown in CW610 Nymph)
1 skein CC2 (Shown in CW100 Cotton Ball)

Needles

Size 6 (4mm) needles or size to obtain gauge Circular needle or dpns in same size needed for hat One dpn needed for three needle bind-off




Three ½+buttons
Tapestry needle
Stitch Holders
Stitch Markers
Standard sewing items

Gauge

20 sts and 28 rows = 4+in stockinette

Abbreviations





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Sts = stitches

WS = wrong side

Ssk = slip, slip, knit these two sts together

Note

Back and fronts are worked separately and then joined at the shoulders. Sleeves are picked up and knit downward. Carry yarn(s) not in use loosely up the side of the garment. When two colors are used in one row, hold one color in the right hand and one in the left.

BACK

Using CC1 cast on 51 (55, 59) sts.

Row 1 (WS): Knit. Rows 2 and 3: Knit.

Row 4: Using MC, knit.

Row 5: MC, purl.

Row 6: Using CC1 k1, *CC2 k1, CC1 k1; rep from * across.

Row 7: Using CC1 p1, *CC2 k1, CC1 p1; rep from * across.

Row 8: MC knit. Row 9: MC purl.

Row 10: CC1 k1, *p1, k1; rep from * across.

Row 11: CC1 knit. Cut CC1.

Row 12: CC2 k1, *p1, k1; rep from * across.

Row 13: CC2 purl. Cut CC2.

Using MC only continue in stockinette until back measures 6 (7, 8)+from cast on. Place stitch markers at each edge for sleeve placement. Continue in stockinette until back measures 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ (12, 13 $\frac{1}{2}$)+. Place sts on holder for shoulders and back neck.

LEFT FRONT


Using CC1 cast on 25 (27, 29) sts. Work same as for back until front measures 6 (7, 8)+ending after a WS row. Place marker on right edge for sleeve placement.

Shape Neck

Row 1 (RS): Knit to last 4 sts, ssk, k2.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Repeat these two rows until 13 decreases are worked: 12 (14, 16) sts remain. Work even until front measures the same as back to shoulders. Place sts on holder for shoulder.



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RIGHT FRONT

Using CC1 cast on 25 (27, 29) sts. Work same as for back until front measures 6 (7, 8)+ending after a WS row. Place marker on left edge for sleeve placement.

Shape Neck

Row 1 (RS): K2, k2tog, knit to end.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Repeat these two rows until 13 decreases are worked: 12 (14, 16) sts remain. Work even until front measures the same as back to shoulders.

Three Needle Bind Off/Shoulder Join

Return back sts to needle and with right front and back sts RS tog work 3 needle bind off.

Using a dpn, put needle through the first st on the front needle and then through first st on the back needle, k as usual. Repeat for second st. There are now two sts on the right needle. Lift first st over last st and off the needle. One st is now bound off. Repeat across each shoulder.

SLEEVES

(Make two)

Using MC, pick up and knit 47 (51, 57) sts between markers. Working in stockinette, dec 1 st at each edge every fourth row 6 (8, 10) times. Work even on 35 (35, 37) sts until sleeve measures 2+shorter than desired length; 4 (5, 6)+. End after a WS row. Do not cut yarn. Join CC2.

Row 1 (RS): With CC2, knit.

Row 2: CC2 purl.

Row 3: CC1 k1, *p1, k1; rep from * across.

Row 4: CC1 knit.

Row 5: MC k1, *p1, k1; rep from * across.

Row 6: MC purl.

Row 7: CC1 k1, *CC2 k1, CC1 k1; rep from * across.

Row 8: CC1 p1, *CC2 k1, CC1 p1; rep from * across. Cut CC2.

Row 9: MC knit.


Row 10: MC purl. Cut MC.

Rows 11-14: CC1 knit.

Bind off.

Sew side and sleeve seams. Weave in ends.

Place markers for buttons and buttonholes; making buttonholes on the left front for boys or the right front for girls.



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FRONT AND NECK EDGING

Using CC1, pick up and knit 52 (60, 68) sts along the right front edge from hem to shoulder, knit across the 27 back neck sts, pick up and knit 52 (60, 68) sts along the left front edge from shoulder to hem. Knit three rows. Cut yarn. Join CC2.

Buttonhole Row

Knit across working (k2tog, yo) at each buttonhole marker.

Knit three more rows. Bind off.

Sew buttons to correspond to buttonholes.

Block sweater.

Hat Pattern

Using circular needle or dpns and CC1 cast on 72 (92) sts. Join being careful not to twist sts. Place marker for beginning of round.

Round 1: Purl.

Round 2: Knit.

Round 3: Purl. Join MC.

Round 4: Using MC, knit.

Round 5: MC knit. Join CC2.

Round 6: *CC2 k1, CC1 k1; rep from * around.

Round 7: *CC2 p1, CC1 k1; rep from * around.

Round 8: MC knit.

Round 9: MC knit.

Round 10: *CC1 p1, k1; rep from * around.

Round 11: CC1 purl. Cut CC1.

Round 12: *CC2 p1, k1; rep from * around.


Round 13: CC2 knit. Cut CC2.

Continue in stockinette using MC until hat measures 4 (5)+from cast on.

Crown Decreases

Larger size only: Knit 1 round decreasing 2 sts. 90 sts

(K8, k2tog) nine times. 81 sts



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Knit one round. (K7, k2tog) nine times. 72 sts Knit one round.

Both sizes: (K6, k2tog) nine times. 63 sts

Knit one round.

(K5, k2tog) nine times. 54 sts

Knit one round.

(K4, k2tog) nine times. 45 sts

Knit one round.

(K3, k2tog) nine times. 36 sts

Knit one round.

(K2, k2tog) nine times. 27 sts

Knit one round.

(K1, k2tog) nine times. 18 sts

Knit one round.

(K2tog) nine times. 9 sts

Finishing

Cut yarn leaving an 18+tail. Thread yarn through tapestry needle and run through remaining sts. Fasten securely. Weave in ends.
